STRESS RELIEF WITH THERAPY DOGS

As final exams and the end of the semester come closer, the stress levels of our students rise. Interactions with therapy dogs can improve energy levels, self-esteem, and mood, as well as decrease stress levels.



THERAPY DOGS WILL BE IN THE BUILDING ON 12/14 DURING 2ND AND 3RD HOURS

Each class will have 15 minutes with the group of therapy dogs in a neutral location. If you would like to opt your student out of time with the dogs, or would like to alert the school of an allergy, please contact our school social worker at akvizenewlothrop.k12.mi.us.

There will be an alternative activity available.

All dogs on campus will be trained and certified therapy dogs.



Please keep students home if they have any of the following:

- Vomiting and/or diarrhea
- Fever of 100 degrees or more within the past 24 hours
- Strep Throat, Covid-19, Scarlet Fever, Pink Eye,
 Meningitis and/or other communicable diseases
- Any sore throat or extreme cough that can be distracting to themselves or classmates

Students may return after:

- Vomit/Diarrhea/Fever free for 24 hours without the use of medication
- 24 hours on antibiotics after a strep throat or pink eye diagnosis

*If your child receives a diagnosis from a doctor, please leave that on the absence line when reporting their absence



CORNHOLE TOURNAMENT RULES


- Boards are 27 feet front edge to front edge.
- · Random draw bracket after registration ends.
- Bag in the hole is 3 points, anything landing on the board is 1 point. Any bag that hits another surface before landing on the board or in the hole will NOT be counted.
- · Own bags allowed.
- Double elimination
- Scores should be reported to the head table after each game by a representative from both teams.
- The first team to 21 wins. Teams are allowed to go over. The round must be completed and both teams agree on the score for a game to finish.
- Please arrive at least 10 minutes before your game. Upon entering, you will be greeted by the
 front desk where you will show them your ID and they will check you in. You will then go to the
 gym to check in with the head table. Further instructions will follow.
- A Photo ID (Student ID/Driver's License) must be show to both the front desk and head table before your game begins.
- The bracket will be posted on the website and Facebook page on December 28th.
- Please do not eat or drink anything other than water in the gym.
- Players should stay in the facility until they have been eliminated as games move quickly.
- No refunds on no-shows. The opponent of the no-show will receive an automatic win. If this is their first loss, the loser's bracket opponent will also receive a win.
- Teams that throw first are marked as such on the bracket. This will be decided randomly. After the first throws, the team that scores more points in that round goes first in the next. If the teams tie, the team that threw first that round will throw first again.
- Bags must be thrown underhand with the front foot not exceeding the front of the board.
- If a player steps over the line once they have thrown the bag, the throw does not count. It will be removed from the board/hole if it lands.

- 20 minute time limit on games. If time runs out, the team in the lead will receive the victory. If
 there is a tie when time expires, there will be a sudden death round. PLEASE ALERT THE HEAD
 TABLE BEFORE STARTING THIS SUDDEN DEATH ROUND SO THAT THEY CAN OFFICIATE. Rules for
 sudden death will be at the head table.
- Cancellations ARE allowed. (Ex: I make it in the hold for 3 points and you land 2 bags on the board so I receive 1 point for my team.)
- Teammates will line up on opposite sides of one another. Players should be straight across from one another during play (same lane so they are facing one another directly and not crossed.)
- Scores shall be discussed after that inning is over. All bags from one side are thrown, the
 opposite side adds the points up and marks the score. (Use Notes app or score keeper on board.)
- Alert the head table of any questions or scoring disputes while playing.
- Alternate bag throws are required. Team 1 throws a bag then Team 2 throws a bag. This process repeats until all bags have been thrown.
- A team who interferes with the opponents bag WILL BE DISQUALIFIED. This includes (but is not limited to) swatting, catching, touching bag in any way OR moving the board.
- Players must stand at least 2 feet away from the board while the opposite side is throwing and not extend their hands to try and catch a bag that is heading toward the board. A bag that is headed right at a player with no change of touching the board CAN be caught for safety reasons.
- If the board is moved in any way from the bags hitting it, it can be reset as long as both teams agree on it. They will call a "Timeout" in the game and resolve the issue.
- If players wish to bring food, they must eat it in the lobby. PLEASE THROW AWAY YOUR TRASH.
- Spectators are allowed inside the gym during play. However, they must remain on the bleachers and not interfere with gameplay. They will be charged \$5 at the front desk (Cash, Visa, Mastercard).
- Players must wait until the opponent's bag lands either on the ground or on the board before they are allowed to throw. If a player violates these rules, the bag does not count.
- DO NOT remove any of the bags (unless they touch the ground first and then land on the board) during the middle of a round. Teams must wait until all 8 bags have been thrown and the score is agreed upon.
- Bags can be knocked off the board by other bags during the round. Remember that bags must be thrown underhand at all times.
- Final scores can be 21-20. Teams do not need to win by 2.
- If you bring anything into the gym (bookbag, medicine, etc.) it shall be put on the bleachers and remain there during gameplay.
- As games finish and teams are eliminated, they are allowed to stay in the gym until the tournament ends as long as they wait on the bleachers and do not interfere with gameplay.
- Teams will be placed at the boards at random. If a player brings their own bags, they can hang onto them and move them as needed.

OTHER NEWS

• We will be offering free memberships to high school students (grades 9–12) during Christmas and Summer Break. High School Memberships will be \$10/month during the rest of the year.
